## THE REVOLUTION WILL NOT BE TELEVISED

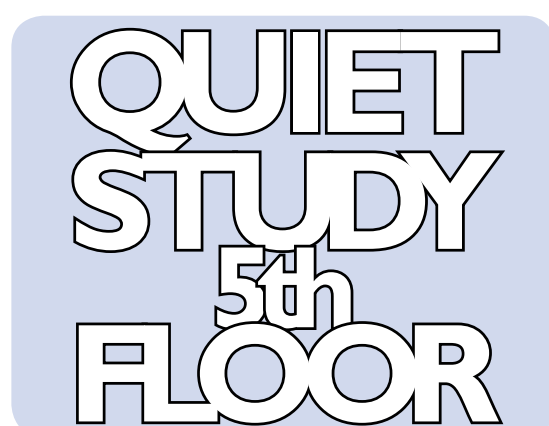
