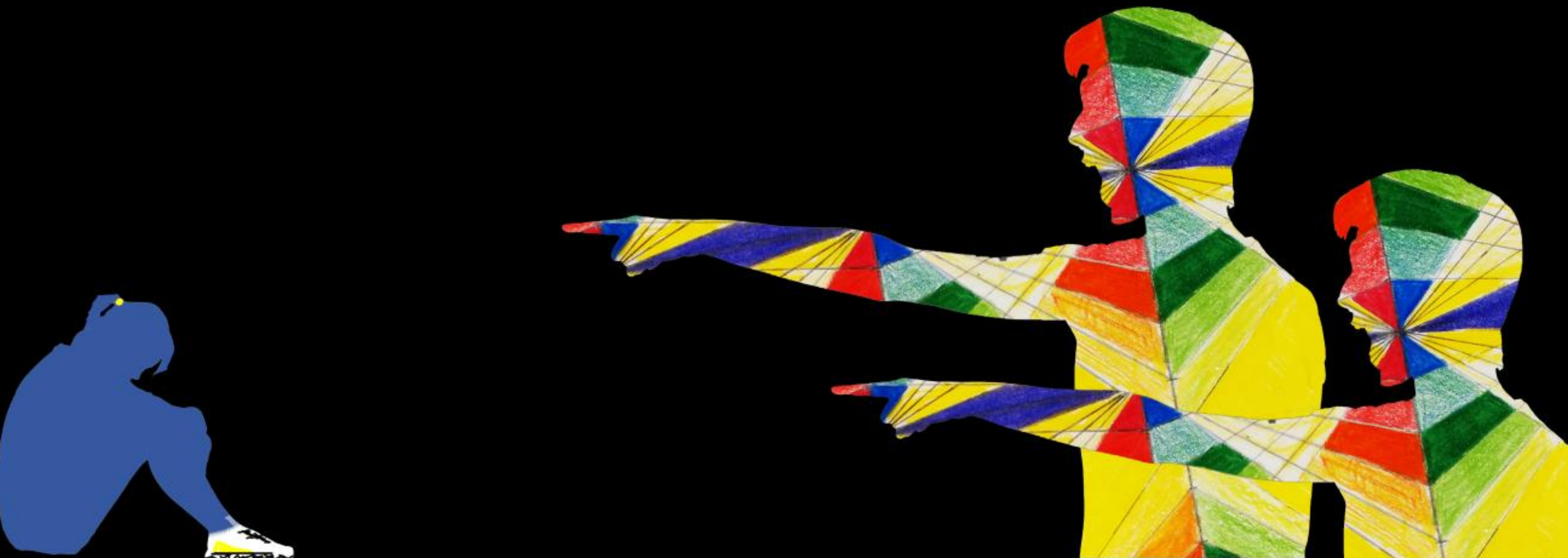

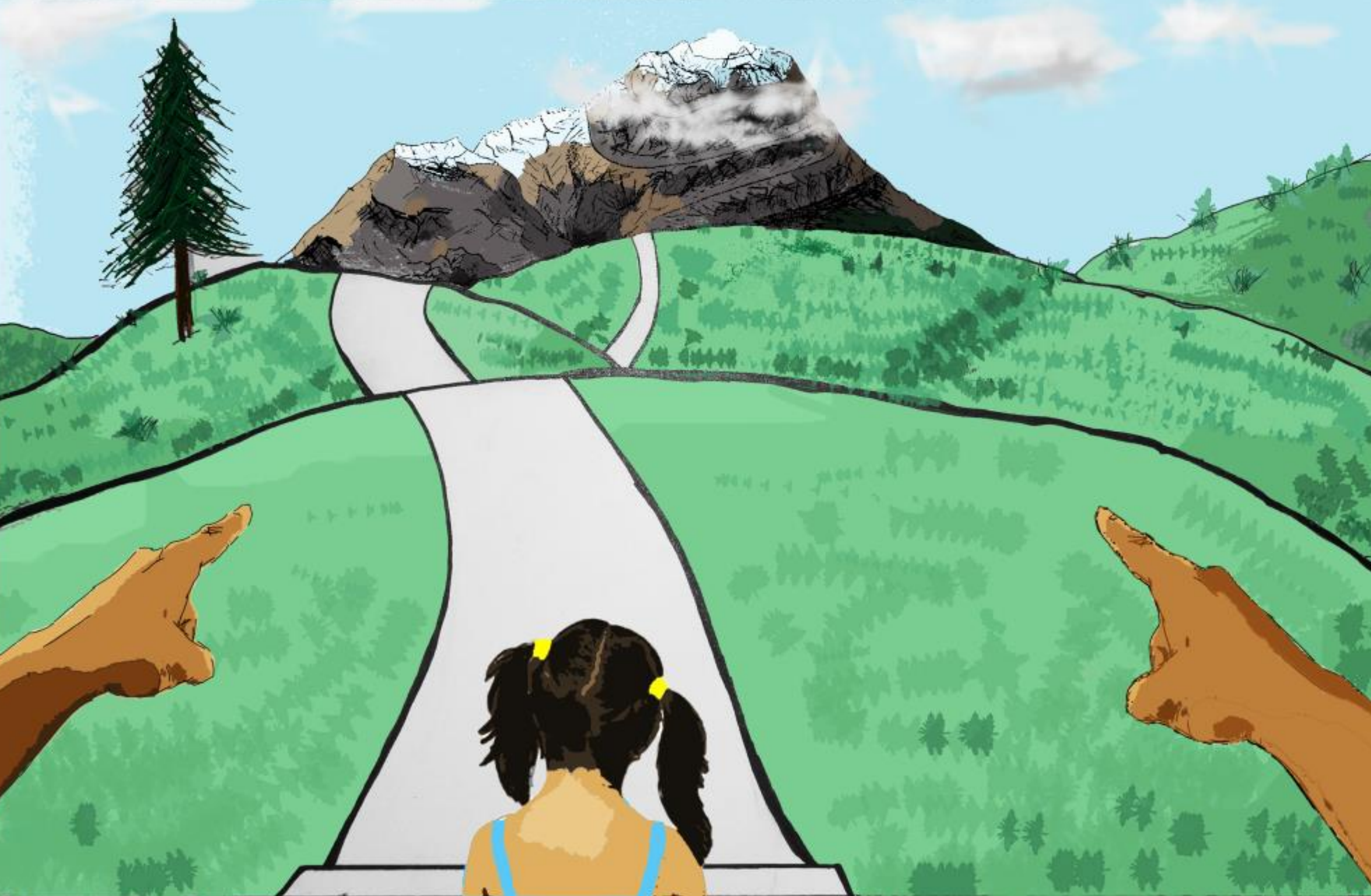

así que fue.

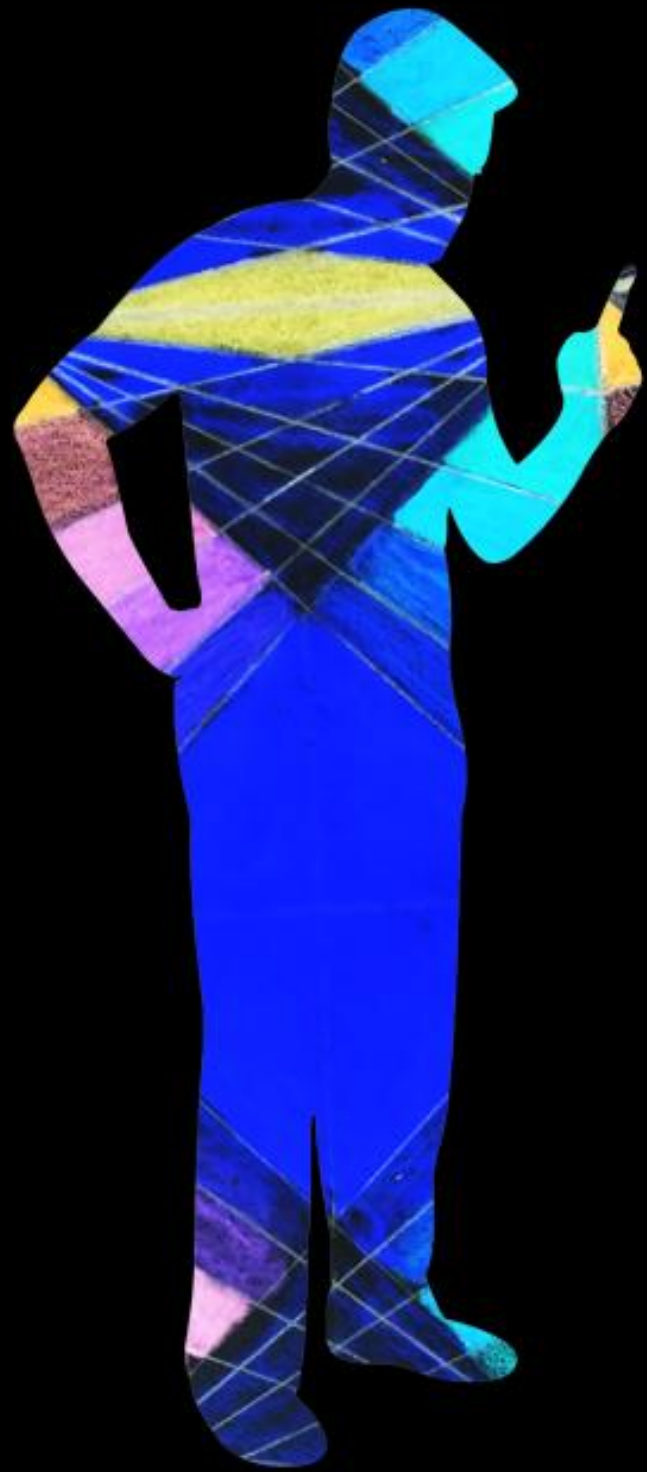


La calle era tan
